
Evening Worship – the Vespers Service

The **Saturday evening Vespers** service is our way, as Orthodox Christians, to <u>weekly</u> experience the beauty of creation - "*How glorious are Thy works O Lord, in wisdom hast Thou made them all..."*, the profound impact of the Fall - "*Lord I call upon Thee hear me..."*, as well as announce the joyous message of the Incarnation of our Lord God and Saviour Jesus Christ – the world's "*Gladsome Light*".

The Vespers service is a beautiful part of our liturgical heritage, but more importantly, it is a fundamental means by which we remind ourselves in this fallen world, that it is only Christ Who brings Light, Joy, and Peace. It is *only* in Him that we will find hope and meaning amidst all the darkness, depression and struggle which surround us.

If you haven't been to Vespers recently, or if you have <u>never been</u> in your lifetime... **now** is the time to deepen your spiritual life - through a broadening of your liturgical life. Come and see!

Sunday of St. John of the Ladder



The Fourth Sunday of Lent is dedicated to St John of the Ladder (Climacus), the author of the work, The Ladder of Divine Ascent. The abbot of St Catherine's Monastery on Mount Sinai (6th century) stands as a witness to the violent effort needed for entrance into God's Kingdom (Mt.10: 12). The spiritual struggle of the Christian life is a real one, "not against flesh and blood, but against ... the rulers of the present darkness ... the hosts of wickedness in heavenly places ..." (Eph 6:12). Saint John encourages the faithful in their efforts for, according to the Lord, only "he who endures to the end will be saved" (Mt.24:13).
