Christ the Saviour Orthodox Book Club

Beginning Fall 2008 we will be starting an Orthodox Book Club at our parish. The format is pretty simple, each quarter we will read a book, then meet at a parishioners home to discuss it. The host family will serve as moderator and provide a snack - as simple or elaborate as you wish! To "kick things off" Fr. Stephen and M. Anna will host the first meeting at the rectory, Sunday September 21st at 6pm. Light refreshments will be served. The book we will be reading this quarter is called: "Thirsting for God in a Land of Shallow Wells" by Matthew Gallatin, 15 copies have been ordered at the price of \$8.95 each. Please see Fr. Stephen to reserve your copy. More copies will be ordered if interest demands.

The description of the book reads: A best-seller, and an outstanding book that will help Orthodox readers more deeply appreciate their faith and will give Protestant readers a more thorough understanding of the Church. In Thirsting for God, philosophy professor Gallatin expresses many of the struggles that a Protestant will encounter in coming face to face with Orthodoxy: such things as Protestant relativism, rationalism versus the Orthodox sacramental path to God, and the unity of Scripture and Tradition. He also discusses praying with icons, praying formal prayers, and many other Orthodox traditions.

> Metropolitan Anthony of Sourozh "THE HOLY TRINITY" Excerpt from a talk 10.11.1986, Kensington Church Council

When we speak of ultimate mysteries like the Holy Trinity we must be aware of the fact that we can have a glimpse, perceive something, but that in the end we must face the mysteries with awe, in adoration and worship in deep silence, listening with all our being, our heart and our mind and our will and our very flesh, in order to hear and to perceive. Turning more specifically to the teaching on the Holy Trinity, we must also realize that however great the mystery, however it is beyond our imagination - we could not have invented a God as the one whom we worship in the Christian faith; it is all that we are capable of perceiving...

God does not reveal either Himself or anything about Himself and the created world simply to satisfy our curiosity. If God reveals something to us, it is in order to teach us something about ourselves singly and ourselves as a body, humanity. And indeed the Russian writer Fedorov, who lived, [and] died... in the 19th century, said that the Holy Trinity is the only prototype of a perfect human society.

And at this point he meets exactly what St Gregory of Nazianze had said centuries before him, when [he] says that it is because God is love that He is One in Three; and because God is One in Three, He is true and perfect, insuperable and triumphant love.
